These are organized by tribe. There are some schedules for most tribes under the Great Lakes jurisdiction, but not all years for all tribes. The contents vary somewhat from year to year, but most schedules contain the following information: Number (enrollment or allotment), English name, Indian name, Age, Sex, and relationship to other members of the family. In some schedules the Indians are listed by number, and in others alphabetically by name.

Judging from the correspondence, the Potowatomie Agency was moved from Carter to Laona, Wisconsin sometime between April and May, 1916.

- Miscellaneous Chippewa File. 1920
Pertains to the bands of Chippewas alternately known as the Post Lake, Rice Lake, or Mole Lake, Wisconsin Bands of Chippewas residing at the time in Forest and Langlade Counties. These bands of Indians were non-reservation Indians who had not been enrolled with any of the other bands of Chippewas at the time of the signing of the Treaty of 1854. Consequently they had received no lands or rights given to the enrolled bands. In January, 1920, Superintendent Bennett was directed to make a full investigation, enrollment and determination of the rights of these bands; ascertain facts with reference to family history, Indian descent, residence, names of parents and grandparents, whether they were enrolled in any other band, and all facts concerning their status and present conditions. This file is the result of this investigation, and includes transcripts of testimony, correspondence with the Commission and Indians. Many of the letters are from Indians asking for rations and aid. Included is a census of the Chippewa Indians of the Laona Agency taken August 1, 1920 by Superintendent Bennett.

Letters regarding the purchase of supplies and equipment by Indian Wards, mainly credit buying. The Indians would do their purchasing from W.P. Reynolds who would write the Superintendent requesting permission to sell a specific item to a specific Indian, and after receiving permission would bill the Superintendent. Mr. Reynolds also acted as an unofficial agent passing on to the Superintendent the conditions and needs of various Indians, news, and gossip. Chronologically arranged.
