My dear Mr. Johnson:

Reference is made to the correspondence regarding  
an alleged double allotment to Lizzie Rice or Mon-o-mo-ne-quah,  
now deceased on the Sac and Fox Reservation, Oklahoma.

A report received from the Superintendent of the  
Potawatomi School, dated November 3, 1814, shows that this  
Indian was allotted as a citizen Potawatomi under the name of  
Me-no-mne-quah, allottee No. 1411, on May 5, 1865. This al-  
lotment was made under the treaty of November 15, 1861 (18  
Stat. L. 1191).

By the treaty of February 27, 1867, (15 Stat. L.  
531), plans were made for the purchase with tribal funds of  
a new reservation for the Potawatomi Indians. The new reser-  
vation contemplated by said treaty was thereafter obtained in  
Oklahoma and allotments were made under the general allot-  
ment act to the Indians removing to that Reservation. These  
allotments were afterward confirmed by the Act of March 3,  
1891 (26 Stat. L. 1016), and the agreement by which the Indi-  
ans ceded all their right, title and interest in and to the Re-  
servation in Oklahoma, was ratified by said act.

Although Non-o-mo-ne-quah was not strictly authorized to take an allotment on the Sac & Fox Reservation in Oklahoma, the Office is of the opinion that her failure to comply literally with the requirements of the law should not bar her heirs from retaining the allotment made to her on the Sac and Fox Reservation, especially in view of the fact that the lands on the Potawatomi Reservation in Oklahoma have been disposed of.
