Your letter of the 31st ultimo, enclosing a communication to you from Agent Palms, and the application of Kaw-ham-a-Petunatorino allottee under the treaty of 1861, for permission to sell a portion of his allotment to J. K. Powers, also a Petunatorino, has been received.

The treaty of 1861 provides that the allotments hereinunder shall be inalienable except to the United States or to members of the Petunatorino tribe, with the permission of the President and under such rules and regulations as may be prescribed by the Secretary of the Interior.

As yet no rules and regulations have been adopted to regulate sales of lands by one State or nation to another, but the subject will receive early attention from this department, the result of which will be communicated to you.

For the foregoing reasons no present action will be had upon the application in question.

Sir:

I transmit herewith a list containing the names of Potawatome Indians, allottees under the provisions of the 2^d article of the treaty with said Indians of November 15th 1861, to whom patents in fee simple for land severally held by them have been issued or directed to be issued by the President of the United States, and who are entitled under the provisions of the 5th article of said treaty and the supplemental article made and concluded March 29th 1866, to receive their proportion of the cash value of the credits of the tribe, principal and interest, held in trust by the United States, and also their proportion of the

proceeds of the sale of lands, as the same
may be received.

To enable you to make these
payments, I have, under instructions from
the Honorable Secretary of the Interior by
letter of the 9th instant, this day caused
a requisition to issue in your favor for
\$408,370.54 to be placed to your credit with the
United States' Assistant Treasurer at St.
Louis, Mo. for the proper care and disposition
of which sum, as per tabular statement
herewith, and in accordance with instructions
herein, you will be held accountable under
your bond.

The sum of \$365,134.50 is to be
divided equally between the 598 persons
who have elected to become citizens, and
whose names appear on the accompanying
list, as their proportion of the cash value

of the credit of the tribe, and the distinctive share of \$610.59 will be paid to each person to whom patent in fee simple for lands to which he is entitled, have actually been delivered, comprising, as you will perceive, the first 527 names on the list; - the others to be paid so soon as they shall have received their patents.

The remainder of the amount now remitted, viz: \$143,236.04, is made up from balances on hand June 30th, 1868, together with one half of the annuity appropriations for the current fiscal year, and will be paid in the same manner as semi-annual payments of annuities have heretofore been made, all the members of the tribe receiving an equal share of the same. The amount thus divided between 2180 persons as per last census, will give to each one the

sum of \$ 19,83, with an undivided surplus of \$ 6,64.

The Hon. Secretary of the Interior has decided that it is not practicable to execute that part of the late appropriation act which authorizes him to sell ~~\$ 1,80~~⁶⁰⁰ parts of the several classes of bonds, to the amount of \$ 217,200.00, held in trust by him for the Potawatome Indians, this fractional part being the proportion due to those members of the tribe who have elected to become citizens. Action under the provision of this law will therefore be suspended until the matter can again be submitted for the consideration of Congress.

Mr. James H. Saville of the Treasury Department has been detailed for duty in connection with the payments about to be made by you, and will leave here this evening with instructions to report to you at St. Louis Mo.

Upon application being made by you

To the Commanding General of the Department
of the Missouri a military escort under
the command of a Commissioned officer
will be detailed to accompany you to the
Indian Country.

In connection with this subject
I transmit herewith a copy of a communica-
tion from the Hon. Secretary of War, en-
closing a copy of General Order No. 74, touching
the detail referred to.

I also call your attention to the 2^d
Section of the late Indian Appropriation
Act relative to the manner in which annuities
under its provisions are to be distributed
to the Indians.

In making the payments you will
take the receipt of each individual to whom
the money is due, said receipt to be attested
by Mr. Saville, by the officer in command
of the escort and by the Agent and
Interpreter for the Pottawatomie Indians.
Should by sickness or other contingency
any of these parties be prevented from attending
as witness to the payments, you will

substitute some other competent person to act in his stead, stating, in your report, what contingency rendered such substitution necessary.

In no case will a payment be made to an Agent or attorney, or to any other than the party to whom the money is due, unless where such person may since have died, in which event payment will be made to the heirs or representatives of the deceased, in accordance with the laws of Kansas.

Great care and circumspection will be exercised in ascertaining the identity of the claimants, and where any one, entitled to share in the payment, cannot be found, his or her portion of the money will be retained and accounted for by you accordingly.

It is confidently expected that in the discharge of the important duties hereby entrusted to you, you will use every care and diligence, so as to complete the payments in the least practicable time.

Deeds and other instruments of Writing,
The deed must be accompanied with a certificate of the Superintendent of Indian Affairs, or the Indian Agent, if the facts are within his personal knowledge, of the precise consideration paid or secured to be paid, whether in money or other property, with sums, dates, and such other incidental matters connected therewith, as will show the true character of the contract and transactions; also if the Grantor is the individual for whom the reservation was made and is capable of taking care of and properly managing his property and that the consideration is a full and fair price for the lands intended to be conveyed; or if the facts should not be within the personal knowledge of the Agent, then the affidavit of some disinterested and credible person, known to him who possesses such knowledge, and who has not acted as Agent of either of the parties must be forwarded -

Sir:

I have the honor to forward herewith
a list of persons, members of the Pottawatomie
tribe of Indians, applying for Patents to land,
allotted under the Treaty of 1861, and who
are certified by the Business Committee of
the tribe as being fitted to be entrusted with
the management of their own affairs.

Names are affixed to the names to correspond
to the numbers upon the Allotment-list on file
in the Office. I would respectfully endorse the opin-
ion of the Committee in regard to the above list.
In the case of nearly all embraced in the list ap-
plications have been forwarded and Certificates
of Naturalization are supposed to be on file at
the Department. In the case of Amable Taup
No 1762 on the list it may be proper to state
he has not resided upon the Pottawatomie
Reservation since the allotments were made, but
is residing with his family in Wisconsin. I would
suggest that, although there is no record
of his having his name affixed

be as well to delay the issue of a patent to him
until he shall have become a resident in
the country.



These persons are identical in both lists, and have by deception obtained allotments of land on both Reserves. It requires much care in a large tribe to prevent dishonest persons from getting enrolled twice, for both annuities and lands. In the case of these persons, they managed to get enrolled three or four times on the original Potowattamie Land List, and doubtless received as many annuities at the payment made at the time of the sale as made. I discovered the fraud before

the lands were allotted, and they received but one allotment each at the Reserve - Wm. However, I made the allotments to the Kickapoos last Feb. These persons slipped in there, got enrolled with the band of Potowatamies which is residing there, and thus again obtained allotments. It was not till my return to this Reserve this winter, that I discovered this last fact.

Of course one or the other of these two sets of allotments should be canceled, and I will also suggest that the proper Agent be notified of the cancellation, to prevent these persons from claiming and receiving annuities in both tribes on the strength of their allotments, as it is doubtless double annuities rather than lands, that they are seeking by means of a double enrollment.

I am informed by parties here that these persons legitimately belong to the Kickapoos - and should be struck off from the list here; but I cannot speak for this. However, this last election was among the Kickapoos where they received as much smaller allotments. They should be given the right to have them back.

Sir.

Among the allotments to members of this tribe is one to Enoch Stevens, No. 756 on the role. Mr. Stevens is a white man who had been married to an Indian girl, but who was not living with her at the time of the allotments.

In consideration of his reported marriage, and of the then understood fact that the separation was no fault of his, we recognized him as a member of the tribe and allotted him 8.0 acres of land.

It subsequently appeared that he had a white wife to whom he had long previously been married and consequently his subsequent marriage with the tribe was void, but through the oversight of his name was continued on the role and was registered with the other allotments. He is now, and for a long time has been, living with his original (white) wife upon this Reservation, and it therefore seems to me proper that

the name should be struck from the allotment list
and his allotment canceled.

I respectfully recommend that this course
be taken.
