Pottawatomie Agency K.T. June 6th 1860.

Sir.

I have the honor of forwarding herewith a Statement for the month of May, having been in attendance on the U.S. District Court at Tecumseh, which commenced its session on the 28th day of May, and being detained there one week, accounts for my monthly Statement for May, not reaching your Office in due time. You will also please find enclosed a list of Pottawatomies for whom County land warrants have been issued, they have requested me to inquire of the Department what disposition has been made of the warrants. They say it is a subject which they have urged for several years past, through former Agents, and that they have never received one cent in value for the warrants. You will please aid me in receiving an immediate answer to their inquiries upon this subject. I am pleased to inform you that the health of the Indians of this Agency is at present very good, their Mechanics are discharging their duty, their schools are progressing as usual, and their crops since the late rain are quite promising. On last Monday the 4th inst we held a general Council, some of the proceedings of which, I design giving you in a future communication.
